

# Biographical Information

Sonali Mohapatra is an accomplished Odissi dancer and a global performer having expertise in the Abhinaya (expression) and Nritta (pure dance) aspects. She started learning Odissi when she was just 4 years old and fell in love with the form. At an early age of 5, Sonali lost a major portion of her hearing. On the left ear, she lost 100% and on the right ear 87% hearing due to unfortunate medical negligence, which remains irreparable. In such a difficult state, with



her strong will power she developed the knack for learning Odissi dance. Despite it being a tough challenge to learning any from of dance and music which demands a sufficient command over "Shruti" (Hearing) with "Swara" and "Taal", Sonali mastered the art form with grace and enthusiasm. Unable to hear music and song properly, she can only make out the rhythm with the help of a hearing

instrument. It is through the Taal that she feels the lyrics and the music. Her father has given her the vocal support and helped her understand different Taal and their "layakariyan" ever since childhood whereas her late mother used to guide, escort and help her in learning the theories

of Odissi dance and brought her numerous dance books and magazines. Her elder and younger brothers helped her to develop communication skills and speech. Today she responds to her surroundings by observing

lip movement and feeling the vibrations of sound.

Starting her early training under the supervision of Guru Smt. Truptimayee Mohanty, she went on to train under the guidance of Guru Shri Durga Charan Ranbir, one of the torch bearers of the Guru Debaprasad style of Odissi. In 1995, she received her higher training in Odissi Dance and completed Visharad

and Alankar. In 2011 she was awarded the prestigious Ustad Bismillah Khan Yuva Puraskar.

With her tremendous efforts and

dedication, Guru Sri Durgacharan Ranbir's blessings and goodwill, moral as well as physical support from her family member, she has made a name of being one among the best dancers of Guru Shri Deba Prasad Das gharana. In 2004, she got married to the eminent flute player Shri Ahiram Nanda, a disciple of Guru Shri Mohini Mohan Patnaik and Padmavibhushan Pandit Hariprasad Chaurasia.





### **Event organized by NUP**

Every year, NUP organizes dance and music festivals, workshops and seminars to help boost the learning process for its students. Parirambhanam:- This is the annual function organized to provide a platform for the young disciples of the institute to encourage and engage them. Students are given prizes and certificates according to their performances to encourage them.

Manchapradarsan:- This is an opportunity for budding dancers to perform solo and have a space of their own to promote themselves and their dance. The student selected for this gets to perform live with a band of renowned musicals.

Chhanda Ninaad:- This is an international festival of Indian classical dance &

music. It is a 3 day long festival to showcase the talents of world renowned artists. Pandits,

Ustads, Padmashree, Padma vibhushan, and experts in different fields of art grace the festival.

Sadhana:- This is an International festival, where young and talented artists

around the world come together to celebrate the richness of art and culture.

Atithi Devo Bhava:- Artist from outside the state and country are

invited to the Institute to demonstrate their art and interact with the students.

Apart from the events;

NUP is the registered examination center.

Theory classes are regularly taken by the Guru to ensure a holistic learning for the students.

Students get the opportunity to practice with live Mardala wearing Ghungroo.

NUP organizes makeup, hairdo and costume tutorial classes at regular intervals.

NUP undertakes summer and winter workshops for students to learn new items.

Special classes on Taal is taken by the Guru.

Yoga classes are regularly given to the students to ensure better physical and mental health.

NUP undertakes different health camps.

NUP organizes plantation drive to promote greenery and a healthier environment.

We at NUP believe that no one is different and that it is through art, dance and music that we all come together. NUP has initiated a programme called "Wings of the Disable People" to make art inclusive and to make a positive impact on the society. People with hearing and speaking difficulties enroll at NUP to learn dance, music, painting, yoga and more recently, mask making. Inclusivity of the disabled people and removing the stima around mental health and physical disability is a cause very dear to the institution.
